CESifo and the Department of International and European Economic Studies (DIEES) at the Athens University of Economics and Business (AUEB) invite the submission of papers on the question of

“Human Capital and the Global Division of Labor”

for the CESifo–Delphi Conference, June 12-13, 2009. The conference will take place at the **European Cultural Centre in Delphi, Greece.**

Among the relevant topics for this conference are:

- Human capital and the growth process in an integrated world economy
- Migration and human capital formation
- Human capital versus physical capital taxation and product specialization across countries
- Human capital, technological change and inequality in a global context
- Human capital and the fragmentation of production activities across countries
- Other topics along these lines.

Among the economists who have already accepted our invitation to present a paper at the conference are **Philippe Aghion** (Harvard University), **Elias Dinopoulos** (University of Florida), **Oded Galor** (Brown University), and **Joseph Zeira** (Hebrew University of Jerusalem).

It is expected that selected papers from the conference will be published either as a special issue in a Journal, or as an edited volume.

Full papers or extended abstracts (500-600 words) should be submitted by **December 20, 2008**. For submission, please visit www.cesifo.org. A decision **on accepted papers for presentation** at the conference will be announced by **January 20, 2009**. Authors with accepted papers will have their meals and accommodation provided and their economy travel costs reimbursed.
