Founded in 1884, *FinanzArchiv* is one of the world's oldest professional journals in public finance. *FinanzArchiv* publishes original work in all fields of public economics, including taxation, subsidies, revenue, fiscal policies and the behaviour of economic agents, publicly provided goods, national, state, and local government expenditure and related policies, federalism and intergovernmental relations, international fiscal issues, public choice, social policy, and welfare economics.

Special emphasis is on high-quality theoretical and applied papers as well as papers on fiscal policy issues which are of interest to an international readership.

*FinanzArchiv* is listed in the Social Science Citation Index (SSCI impact factor for 2007 0.296), in Current Contents/Social and Behavioral Sciences, in Econ Lit, in the *Journal of Economic Literature*, in IDEAS and RePEc (IDEAS impact factor Oct. 2008 1,43), and in the International Bibliography of Social Sciences.

*FinanzArchiv* is peer-reviewed and published quarterly by Mohr Siebeck, Tübingen, Germany. Submissions are handled by three editors, supported by an advisory board and an international board of associate editors. Manuscripts must be in English and should be submitted online. There is no submission fee. Subscribers can get full text online access to all published papers.
