## Workshop description

The aim of the conference is to bring together researchers investigating issues connected with unemployment in the European context. We welcome submissions taking eclectic approaches to understanding European unemployment, including those utilising macroeconomic equilibrium models with calibration and those employing micro-based partial or general equilibrium search frameworks estimated using panel or event history data.

We are particularly interested in submissions that apply analytic tools to current topics of policy interest. Policy topics may include, but are not limited to, levels and durations of unemployment benefits, the impact of the social security system on life cycle labour market behaviour and welfare, minimum wages and labour market outcomes, government-sponsored training and growth, etc.
