Workshop description

It is difficult to exaggerate the growing importance of China in the global economy. Economists and commentators alike these days are re-assessing China's economic prowess not in terms of what China could do during normal times but in view of China's ability to withstand both the 1997 and the current global finance crisis. Indeed, they are emphasizing the importance of the policies pursued by China and other emerging countries in pulling the global economy out of its current recession.



The conference would offer an excellent opportunity for researchers to present their original research on the evolving role of China in the global economy and its economic implications. The conference's general theme is contemporary issues related to China's role in the global economy. Possible topics include, but are not necessarily limited to, the following:

- The Chinese Renminbi – its valuation and prospect as an international currency
- China and international monetary architecture
- Capital flows – foreign direct investment, outward direct investment, and capital flight
- The decoupling debate
- China's economic policy and global imbalances

We also would like to strike a good balance between academic rigor and practical relevance, and offer alternative viewpoints on China's multiple roles in the global economy.
