CESifo and the Department of International and European Economic Studies (DIEES) of the Athens University of Economics and Business (AUEB) invite the submission of papers on the question of

“Global Economic Imbalances: Prospects and Remedies”

for the CESifo–Delphi Conferences in 2005/2006. Relevant topics include issues such as

- The role of the Euro in a changing international environment
- The viability of the US current account deficit
- Multilateral exchange rate regimes and policy coordination
- Financial and exchange rate crises
- Re-regionalization: the role of currency and trading blocs

and other topics along these lines. Applied theoretical and empirical work that stresses policy-implications, especially from a US and European perspective, is particularly welcome.

The CESifo–Delphi Conferences work as a two-stage process. Authors of accepted papers will be invited to present their papers at the first conference meeting in Munich, November 11-12, 2005. After presenting their papers at the Munich workshop, authors may want to submit non-technical versions of their papers for the second conference meeting in Delphi, Greece, June 2-3, 2006. The second conference meeting will feature a selection of the stage-one papers submitted and a number of invited speakers. The proceedings will be published in the CESifo Seminar Series with the MIT Press subject to a referee process.

Full papers should be submitted by June 1, 2005. A decision on accepted papers for the Munich conference will be announced by the end of June 2005.

Papers should be sent in triplicate to CESifo, Poschingerstr. 5, 81679 Munich, Germany or should be sent as a pdf-file to office@cesifo.de.

Authors with accepted papers will have their meals and accommodation provided and their economy travel costs reimbursed for both the Munich and the Delphi meetings.
